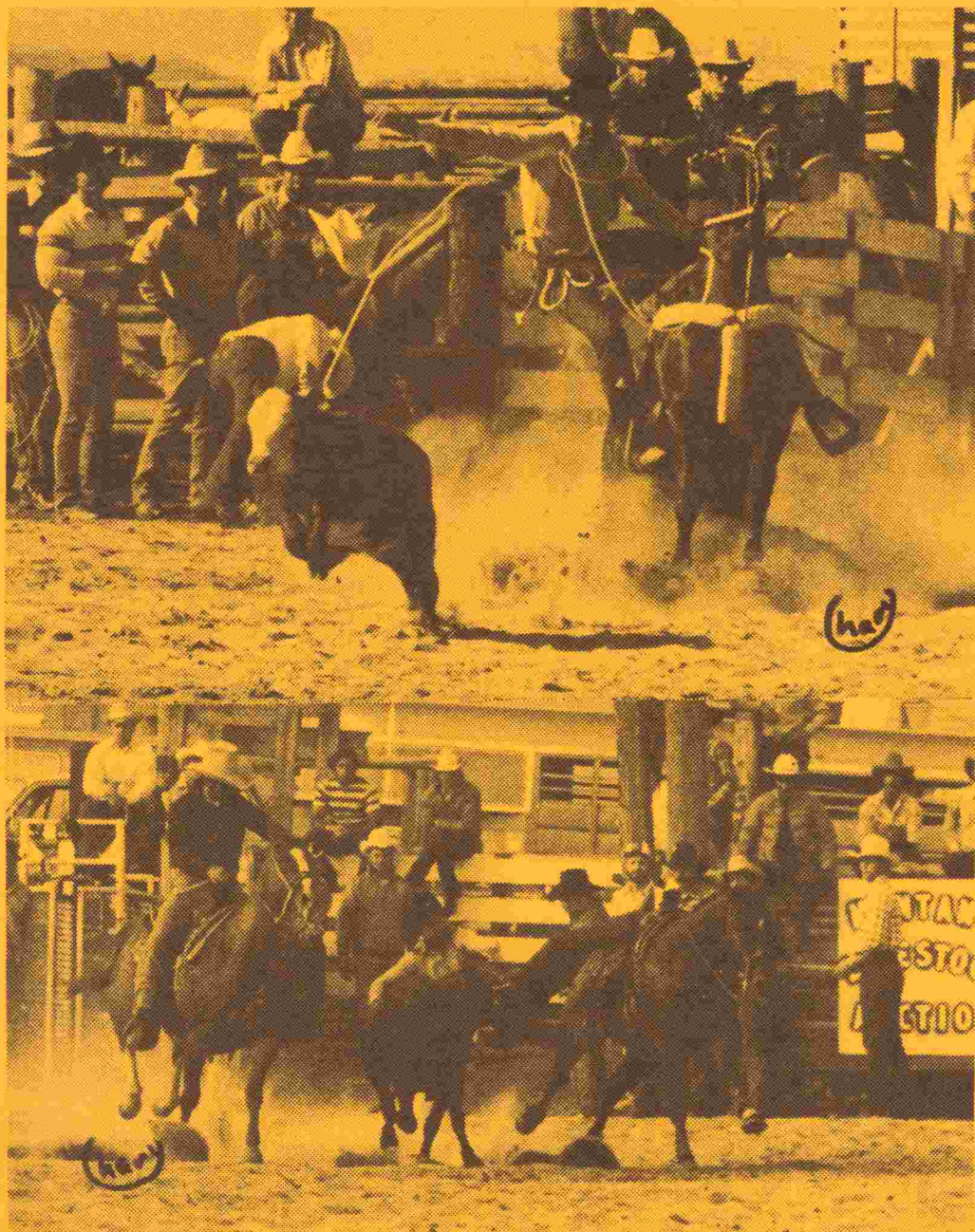

The NARC Finals is getting closer also. The first three in each event will qualify for that big rodeo to be held in the Denver Coliseum Nov. 4-10, so everyone is really "wiring up" to get up in those standings. It will be worth your while.

The Coors Appreciation Rodeo is scheduled for Sept. 19 and 20 at the Central Montana Fairgrounds in Lewistown with Dale Small and Don Jacobs furnishing stock. Co-approved with the MRA, and with a \$400 purse in each event, the rodeo promises to be a bang-up finale to a successful rodeo season. R.C. Cola is sponsoring the junior events. Performances are scheduled to begin at 2 p.m. both days. See the rodeo listings for further information.

Now that the postal strike is over in Canada, we will be mailing the Canadian newsletters again, but we can't guarantee what happens to them once they leave here. Ask the secretaries for one, Canadians, if you don't get one. The other newsletters will be mailed as usual, with mailing list revisions taking more and more hours for your old editors. Board of Directors Meet

At the board of directors meeting on Aug. 13 in Billings, it was the board's decision on the Columbia Falls Rodeo to count the bull riding points into the association standings, but not the ladies breakaway points due to the fact that the ladies breakaway roping was not shown on the approval form nor advertised in the NRA newsletter.

The method for choosing stock at the finals was discussed. Ed Waldhauser read the motion that was approved at the board meeting in February. Bill Stovall moved to rescind the entire motion made at that meeting and have it read, "Each contractor will be entitled to bring at least three head of stock in each riding event to the finals. All stock being considered will be provided by a list submitted by the contractors and the top 20 contestants. The finals selection is to be voted upon by the top 20 contestants in each riding event." Butch Bratsky seconded, motion carried.

It was also agreed that Bill Stovall will again be responsible for getting the lists together and out to the contestants.

Team Rodeo To Be Held

A team rodeo is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 12 and Sunday, Sept. 13 in Dickinson, N.D., to be held in conjunction with that city's Oilfield Festival celebration.

Montana has been asked to with them in this rodeo and we have accepted.

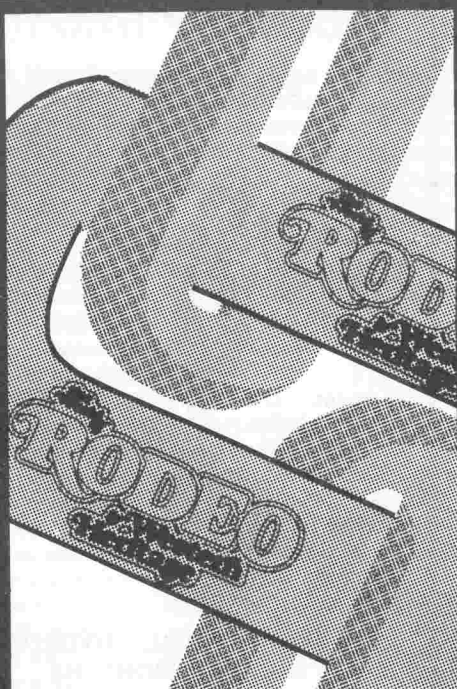

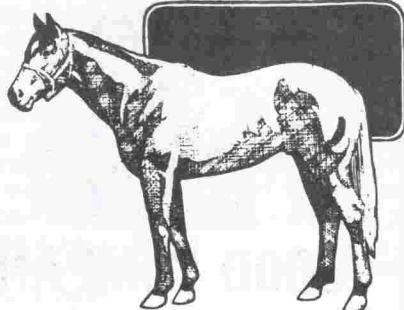

Urban Cowboys vs. Real Cowboys

MBRA Futurity Barrel Race

The Montana Barrel Racers Association is having a Futurity Barrel Race on Sept. 19 and 20 in conjunction with the Coors Appreciation Rodeo in Lewistown.

The Futurity has added money of \$300, and the open barrel race has added money of \$400.

The Rules for the Futurity are as follows:

1. The Futurity is open to horses that are five years old or younger. Horses must not have reached the age of six by the time of the Futurity.

2. To enter in the Futurity, the horse may have competed in any previous 1981 Futurity. The horse must never have competed in any other barrel races (this includes Registered Shows, Rodeos, Playdays, Showdeos, etc.). To do so means forfeit of any and all fees paid and elimination from this Futurity. Horses may have been entered in other events.

3. The Futurity will be held under MBRA rules pertaining to the barrel race. It will be supervised by the MBRA officers and/or directors, and their decision will be final.

4. Owners may enter and ride more than one horse. The owner does not have to ride. Either male or female rider is allowed. There is no age limit on the rider.

5. The Futurity will be held Sept. 19 and 20, 1981 at Lewistown, Mont. in conjunction with the Coors Appreciation Rodeo.

6. If possible, an electric eye will be used.

7. A photocopy of the front and back of the registration papers on registered horses must accompany the entry fee. A veterinarian's affidavit of year of birth and complete description on the unregistered horses must accompany the entry fee.

8. There will be two-go rounds in the Futurity. The average of the two go-rounds will determine the Championship Standings.

9. Substitutions allowed only due to illness or death of horse. A veterinarian's affidavit of proof must accompany substitutions along with a \$15 fee. Deadline for substitutions is Sept. 15, 1981.

10. Entry Fee: \$50.00, PAID BY SEPT. 1, 1981.

11. There will be an office charge of 5% of the total entry fee per horse, with the balance being added to the purse. The division of the purse will be 30% to each go-round and 40% to the average.

Distribution of Money: 1-10 horses, 3 monies (50-30-20%); 11-20 horses, 4 monies (40-30-20-10%).

21 - 30 horses, 5 monies (30-25-20-15-10%)

NRA - MRA Affiliation

There has been much talk for several years about a possible affiliation of some kind between the two Montana rodeo associations, the Montana Rodeo Association (MRA) and the Northern Rodeo Association (NRA), formerly called the Northcentral Montana Rodeo Association (NCMRA). Many will tell you there are bigger differences, but basically, the only difference between the two associations is that the MRA has rodeos mostly west of the mountains (not always) and the Northern Rodeo Association's rodeos are mainly in the east. Many of the same cowboys and cowgirls rodeo in both associations, but for the main, most people stick around home where they can rodeo on weekends and still be home on Monday morning to go to work.

The past six months or so there has been more talk of a possible affiliation, mainly because the NRA has been able to develop a very successful finals and the MRA has been struggling with a finals. And many thought it would be a good idea to involve the MRA in the finals of the NRA to make it a true Montana Rodeo Finals. And, the possibilities of more sponsorships would be greater also, if there were just one association, according to those who know. Well, of course, when you get people talking about something like that it just gets bigger and bigger, and pretty soon affiliation comes into being. Needless to say, this happened, but there has been NO decision made on ANYTHING.

However, the members of both associations were polled as to their thoughts on the whole situation at the Butte rodeo (since it was thought that most members from both associations would be at that big rodeo). So ballots were printed up, and when the cowboys and cowgirls paid their entry fees, they were to vote one way or another, and then give their thoughts on how this could be accomplished, since NOTHING had ever been suggested that EVERYONE agreed upon, and it was thought that the membership should have the say. So the vote was taken — 47 against, 208 in favor, and 14 undecided, with a total of 269 voting (500 ballots were printed). The ballot read, "For (or against) an affiliation between the Northern Rodeo Association and the Montana Rodeo Association." "Comments both for and against and/or suggestions on ways this could be implemented."

The directors of both associations had not, and still have not, decided upon anything, because they both wanted to get the feelings of the members, so the comments portion of the ballot was very important. But, apparently, no one believed this because there weren't an

awful lot of comments, which was unfortunate. Several said, "It would be a good thing if it was done right." Needless to say this isn't exactly what kind of direction the directors needed, because they wanted to have suggestions on just how to do it right. But there were some other good comments.

A suggestion was made to keep both associations the way they are, with one finals for both, perhaps running both associations as separate circuits with points won counting toward the end of the year for the finals. That way people could still stay close to home or rodeo in their own association and still win enough to go to the finals.

Another suggestion was for those who wanted to go to the finals to buy joint cards — or a card in each association, or something like this — and then if they wanted their points to count for the finals, they would.

One person suggested that perhaps if the two associations merged, then another smaller, rival association would spring up to fill the needs who only rodeo close to home, who don't like the stiff competition, etc., etc. Someone else commented that the two associations should just co-approve more rodeos.

Most ballots had NO comments on them.

The whole thing will require much discussion, more voting, more discussion, etc., etc. The directors of both associations are scheduled to meet at the Coors Appreciation Rodeo at Lewistown on Sept. 19 and 20 to discuss (or cuss) the whole thing again. Those with comments both pro and con or ways it could be accomplished, should give these ideas to their directors or presidents so they can have some idea on how the membership feels.

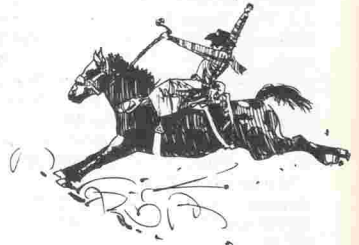
