



ABOUT THE NEW COMPUTER: The Northern Rodeo Association recently purchased an IBM PC Computer for the office. As of now, it has the current membership list on it, can sort it by card number, name or zip codes (for mailings), sorts all members, just east, just west, or male or female, short membership list (contestant name, card number and town), or long list (name, complete address, card number, phone). Last year, Jill Carpenter was nice enough to do all of this on her computer. Thanks, Jill.

The computer also has the suspended list on it, tells the year, the event, the rodeo, stock contractor, name, etc. It has a current turn-out list, too, and tells whether doctor re-

leased, paid the turnout, where, event, name, stock contractor, etc.

The rodeos will also be put into the computer. If you want to see the results of Absarokee or whatever, just push a button and you can see the results. It will also keep the standings. The contestant's card number is entered, and the computer brings up the contestant's name. If you do not have the correct card number, it tells you. (This is why it is VERY important that the contestant's card numbers are correct on the result sheets, including the correct regions).

It keeps track of the all-around money won and event money won. This year, all money won will be kept both by hand and on the computer, in case of "bugs" in the computer program. I look forward to the day that all of the information gets on it! More
