



Rule Changes

Please make note of these rule changes for the 1983 rodeo season.

A sponsoring rodeo committee is a member of the NRA/MRA with one vote per committee at the general membership meeting.

Payoff is to be followed exactly as stated in the rule book, regardless of circumstances. Example: Two contestants entered in an event. Both place in that event. First place to receive 40%, second place to receive 30%, the remaining 20% and 10% of payoff will be ground split between the two contestants.

If contestant's fees are paid but the contestant turns out, the money is figured into the payoff for that event.

Team roping payoff example: 21 teams x \$80 entry fee (\$4; per man) = \$1680 - 3% (\$50.40) = \$1629.60 \div 2 = \$814.80. There will be five (5) places paid in the team roping event.

Dues will be \$60 until April 1, instead of March 15, as previously announced.

Jottings From Jann

1. KNOW YOUR CARD NUMBER WHEN ENTERING A RODEO. THIS IS IMPORTANT AND THE REASON THEY ARE ISSUED. YOU WILL SAVE THE RODEO SECRETARIES AND NRA/MRA OFFICE A LOT OF TIME AND UNNECESSARY WORK. See Page 12, Numbers 30 and 31, NRA/MRA Rulebook.

2. THE BUDDY SYSTEM IS EXPLAINED IN THE 1983 NRA/MRA RULE BOOK ON PAGE 18, NO. 11. "The Buddy System will be limited to two contestants per event, but six people can be on one buddy plan."

3. THE RODEO SECRETARY CAN RE-FUSE TO TAKE YOUR ENTRY IF YOU

DON'T GIVE HER YOUR CARD NUMBER.
Stock Contractors and Rodeo Committees —
Please be aware of the rule that if pickup men,
timers, bullfighters, etc., work more than one
rodeo a CARD must be purchased. Also, a
judge cannot work more than two rodeos in a
row for the same stock contractor. Please
enforce these rules.

I have more complaints in the office recently about card numbers and entry times than ever before. Rule books were sent out with your membership cards. Apparently some of you have misplaced both. When entering a rodeo, know your card number! If someone else enters you, give them your card number. Having a card number upon entering a rodeo in the NRA/MRA is a rule. You are always lined up waiting for your payoff checks after each rodeo. The wait could be shortened considerably if you would help the rodeo secretary by giving her your card number upon entering the rodeo. Looking up 40 or so card numbers before checks can be written does take some time. One rodeo secretary called me at 4:30 p.m. on entry day. Out of 150 entries at that time, 55 did not know their card numbers. Many gave her the wrong numbers to begin with. This is additional work for her and something she should not have to be burdened with at all. Your card numbers are your responsibility.

Notice

Please take note, when entering the rodeos which are co-approved by the North Dakota Rodeo Association, that "enter twice" team roping is allowed. However, in the NRA/MRA, only the top placing counts in the standings. That is, if you place twice, only the higher placing counts in the standings, not both. These rodeos also offer ladies goat tying, which is not an approved event in our association.

Another complaint that is heard after EVERY entry day and call back day, is that entries close at 6 p.m. (or whatever the advertised time may be for that particular rodeo) not at 6:30 p.m., not at 11 p.m., and not the next morning. Same goes for call backs. This is all very well publicized, so there is no excuse. Save yourelf the phone call and bother to the rodeo secretary after entries are closed. Call backs on Thursday morning are uncalled for.

If everyone would at least attempt to cooperate, it would help you, your association, and the people who work for you. If you need to know a card number of someone you are entering, give me a call, and then write it down. If you need rule books, I will be more than happy to send you one. It tells it all right in there.





NARC Notes

Some of the regional rodeo associations which make up the North American Rodeo Commission are rich, some are poor, but they all have one thing in common. They are all interested in ways of raising additional money for their rodeos.

An ingenious plan was disclosed to me recently by Mac McKie, NARC Director. The Canadian Cowboys Association (CCA) is having an Instant Rancher Raffle (IRR). The association will print and sell 2,000 tickets, to be sold at \$50.00 each, thus raising \$100,000. The grand prize winner to be selected at the Finals will receive 50 pregnancy tested high quality beef cattle. They figure about \$40,000 for the cows, \$10,000 for printing and advertising; this leaves about \$50,000 for the Cowboy Countdown, the CCA Finals Rodeo.

For those of you who like to gamble, and since all cowboys are gamblers, this should be

a natural program.

Larry Wirtz, owner of the Northern Rodeo Company in Outlook, Mont., will pay the entry fees at the Coors North American Championship Rodeo for the top individual bareback rider from the North Dakota Rodeo Association, Northern Rodeo Association, and Montana Rodeo Association. He tells me that the bareback riders in these three associations have been awfully nice to the Northern Rodeo Company by selecting their bareback horses for top stock awards. Therefore, he decided to return the favor for the top bareback rider for each of those three associations who will be going to the 1983 NARC Finals.

Jim Roush of Douglas, Wyo. who, along with some partners, put on the bucking horse sale during the 1982 Finals, plans to have another during the 1983 Coors North American Championship Rodeo. They are currently looking for some additional livestock holding facilities in the Denver area. More information on the bucking horse and bull sale, to be held during the NARC Finals, will be published as it

becomes available.






