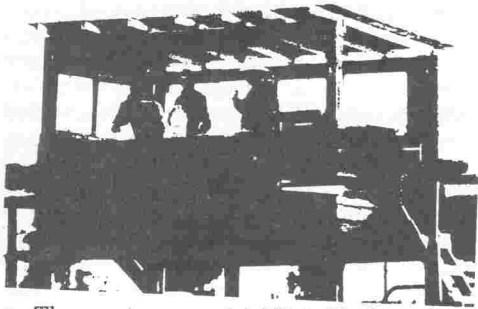

A Genuine Western Classic

Few dispute the surge of pride Montanans feel toward their country. Stir the hearts of these Montanans with a patriotic display, and you create a unique, contagious enthusiasm.

The sight of Old Glory being ushered into the arena by a striking native American girl on a high stepping white horse, complemented by the sounds of the most beautiful song in America rendered by an innocent young child, brought record METRA crowds to their feet to enthusiastically receive the smooth running rodeo to follow — the 1983 NRA Finals.

Some 18,000 people shelled out over \$90,000 to watch the top ten cowboys and cowgirls compete for \$40,000 in total prize money, pitting their skills against the top stock of five Montana stock contractors. Each go-around saw leads change hands, championships at stake and record scores set. And the crowds thronged to the METRA in Billings the first weekend in February in ideal spring-like weather to energetically cheer on the competitors.

Danny Cross skillfully added to his 1983 earnings during the Finals to capture the 1983 all-around cowboy crown with a record \$11,459.90 in NRA earnings. Last year's all-around cowgirl, Lisa Scheffer, entered the

Finals \$1,825.91 behind leader Cinde Barthelmess, and roped and barrel raced her way to a second all-around cowgirl title by winning \$2,600 at this one rodeo alone, boosting her winnings to \$10,069.71, a mere \$24.09 ahead of runner-up Cinde.

Jim Walker came into the finals with a \$753.08 lead in the saddle bronc riding over former champion Don Malli, and, although he rode all three horses, he placed in only one go-around. Malli, on the other hand, came to the Finals to win, and he placed in two go-arounds to tie for first place in the average, but could only come within \$38 of Walker who went back to Lovell, Wyo. with the championship saddle. Butch Reynolds of Corvallis tied with Malli for the average. Kail Mantle was named saddle bronc Rookie of the Year.

Tracy Mikes broke the METRA record in the bareback riding with an 83 marked on Carpenter's "Hermie's Worm," who was also named Bareback Horse of the Year, on Friday night. Mikes failed to score on his next two horses, however, and Colin Murnion maintained his lead and won the saddle, placing second in all three go-arounds and the average. Mike Lenning was the Finals average winner, with consistent performances, placing fourth in two go-arounds and first in the last go-round. Kevin Kessler of Kearney, Neb., or Belle Fourche, S.D., or Cody, Wyo., or Miles City, Mont., won the Rookie of the Year honors in the bareback riding.

There was nothing boring about the bull riding. Former champ Jim Leatherberry came into the Finals \$491.06 ahead of Big Timber's

Scott Breeding, the 1982 National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association bull riding champion. Breeding used his skill, tenacity, strong young body, and confidence in himself to place in two go-rounds, win the average, and be one of only two cowboys to cover two bulls during the three performance rodeo, to snatch the 1983 bull riding crown out of Leatherberry's grasp. The pride of Big Timber remains the pride of his home town.

Seems as though the steer wrestlers always wait until the last minute to put on stellar performances and keep the audience in suspense with the lead in jeopardy all the time. The heat was on after the first go-round when Rod Lyman hit the dirt and failed to throw his steer. Big Rod showed 'em how the second go-round with a winning 3.99 time, and his closest competition, Bill Davis, failed to throw his steer. Lyman placed second in the third go-around to clinch the 1983 championship, defending his title. Soft-spoken Rodger "Skeeter" Nordahl, however, had three good, consistent runs, placed in two go-rounds, winning the third, and emerged as the Finals average winner. He moved from sixth to fourth place in the year-end standings. Danny

Cross won enough at the Finals to move up from fourth place in the standings to second.

Calf roping Rookie of the Year, Kyle Kosoff of Ogden, Utah, placed in all three go-rounds and won the average at the Finals to pull up from fourth place to second place in the standings. He remained well behind leader Mike Barthelmess, however, and Mike took home his second consecutive calf roping title. Britt Givens, more commonly known as a champion bull rider, took home second in the calf roping average.

NRA rodeo fans from throughout Montana are familiar with a "Huffnuman." It is an expert display of team roping by Glen Hough and Phil Luman. They won their first team roping championship in the NRA in 1972 and have been familiar faces at NRA rodeos ever since, always a threat with their wicked ropes.

This year they entered the finals as partners, even though Hough was \$145.93 ahead of Luman in the standings. They placed in two go-arounds, and won second in the average, and Glen Hough was crowned team roping champion another year. Their time of 7.38 in the third and final go-around was the fastest of

the rodeo, and brought cheers from the crowd as they had just witnessed another, "Huffn-luman." Ironically, the two did not rope together in 1982, and Hough hadn't won enough during the year to qualify for the 1982 finals. The two school teachers put their minds to it in 1983, and their roping skills paid off. Glen Hough has won the NRA team roping championship, sometimes with Phil and sometimes without him, 11 times. A remarkable record for a remarkable pair.

Now the ladies' events. The times were fast and furious in the barrel racing, and the girls ran with reckless abandon in their quest for the big prize money up in their event. This was evident with the number of tipped barrels which all but put a contestant out of the average. Vivian Mefford won two go-rounds, one with the fast time of the rodeo, but knocked over a barrel in the second go-around to keep her out of contention for any average

money. The two leaders, Cinde Barthelmess and Lisa Scheffer, ran good, consistent patterns and Lisa's old horse, "Sorrelly" proved too rapid for Cinde's "Speedy," and Lisa took home the Finals average above second place Cinde, along with \$1600 in barrel racing earnings to pull within about \$1,000 of Cinde's year-end earnings, not enough for the saddle.

The breakaway roping was another story. Kayleen Chaffee knew her neck was on the line coming into the rodeo with seasoned breakaway ropers breathing down her neck. Unfortunately, the pressure got to her, she failed to place in any of the three go-arounds, and was overtaken for the year-end championship by former champion Janie Carlson. Janie, nonetheless, had Shari Schall breathing down her neck, and when the dust settled, Shari was in second place for the year by only \$40.10. Shari failed to place in the third go-around, breaking the barrier on top of superb 2.71, and Janie

retained the lead and the championship. Shari won the Finals average, and Kayleen was pushed down to third place. Cinde Barthelness failed to place in any of the go-arounds, but Lisa Scheffer won first in the first go, and second in the third to place third in the average, adding another \$1,000 to her 1983 rodeo winnings, to pull ahead of Cinde in the all-around race by only \$24.09.

There were a lot of people to thank in the success of the 1983 NRA Finals, including the weather man, who provided the best weather ever for the best mid-winter rodeo in the state of Montana. Promoters and managers George Runquist and Bob Teaff deserve a lot of praise for all their expertise and hard work in developing this rodeo into what it has become; the officers and directors for the leadership, and of course the many cowboys and cowgirls who go down the road all summer, vying for a chance to compete at this, the biggest and the best, all deserve a pat on the back.

It is not time to rest on our laurels, however. "People who rest on their laurels are wearing them in the wrong place," the adage goes. More hard work, more miles traveled, and more chewed off fingernails will be required to make next year's rodeo season and NRA Finals keep up the fine tradition that has been established!

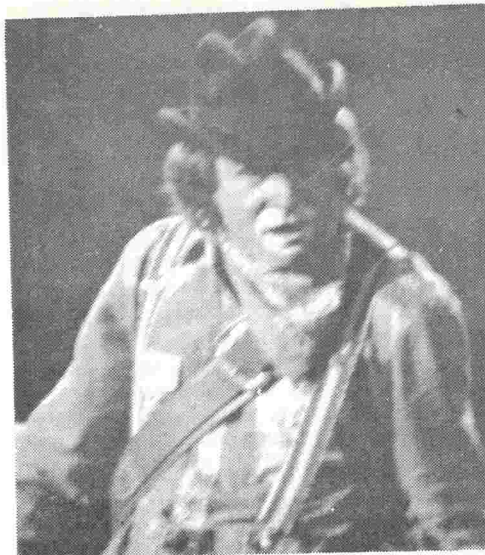
That little person had set the pace and down to the last bucking bull coming out of the chute the Finals was a genuine Western classic.

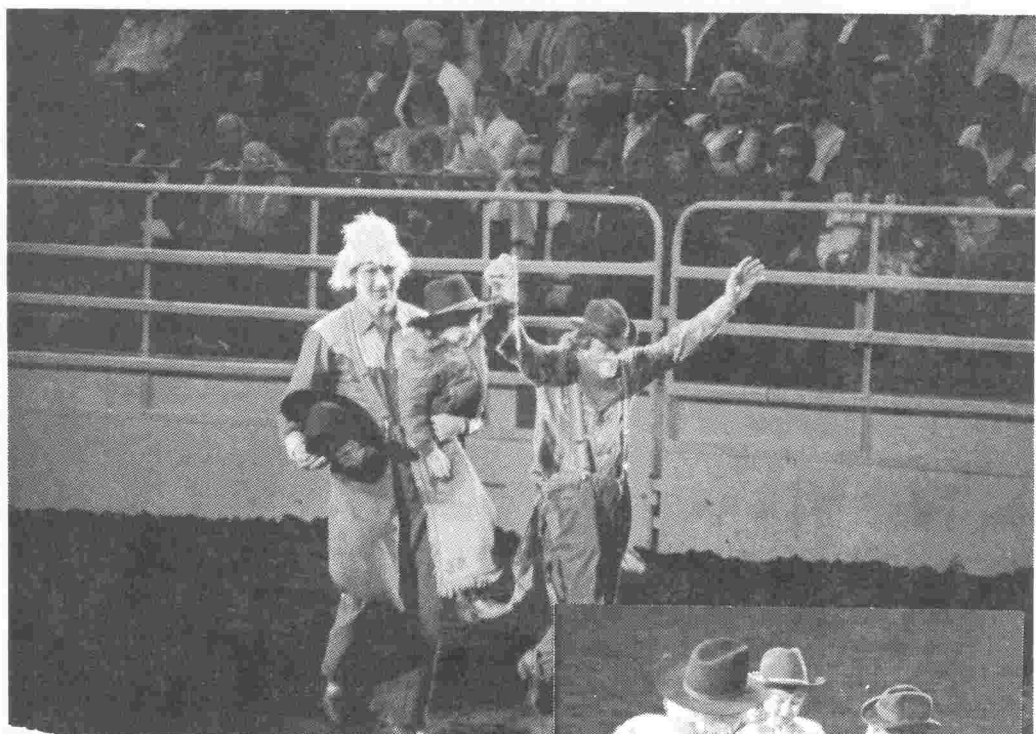


George Runquist, the one man band from Nashville, Tenn., provided pre-rodeo entertainment while the fans poured into the METRA.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

Saturday, Feb. 4, 1984 — 10:30 A.M. — Zonta Room, Yellowstone METRA

President Ed Waldhauser called the meeting to order. The minutes of the meeting held February 5, 1983, were read and approved.

George Runquist brought us up to date on the Finals. The advanced sale of tickets at this time were up. There were 400 more people in attendance for the Friday evening performance in 1984 than in 1983.

The finances of the association were discussed and financial statement was read and approved. The 1983 NRA/MRA Fiscal Year financial statement prepared by the accountant was made available to those in attendance.

Ed Waldhauser introduced the newly elected directors and thanked the outgoing directors for their fine job. The new directors will be: Ladies Barrel Racing, Vivian Mefford; Calf Roping, Danny Cross; Bareback Riding, Bill Stovall; Saddle Bronc Riding, Don Malli; Ladies Breakaway Roping, Cinde Barthelmess; Stock Contractor Director, Dale Small.

The North American Rodeo Commission was discussed. Bryan Lonski informed the membership that the funding for 1984 for NARC will remain the same as in 1983, which is \$6,250 per association membership. Ed Waldhauser informed the membership that the formal merger of the NRA and MRA went into effect on Feb. 1, 1984, per terms outlined in the Working Agreement signed Feb. 5, 1983. Lonski informed the membership that the NARC Finals rodeo will be held once again in Denver for 1984. The membership directed questions to Mr. Lonski in regard to the NRA/MRA membership to the North American Rodeo Commission. If the NRA wished to purchase two memberships as two associations in NARC, the cost would be \$12,500 (same as 1983) and the NRA/MRA would be able to send six (6) contestants per NARC sanctioned event to Denver. If the NRA/MRA chooses to join as one association, the cost for membership would be \$6,250, and the NRA/MRA would be eligible to send three per NARC sanctioned event to Denver, and the NRA would lose \$1,000 Coors money (used as added money at the Finals.)

Ed Miller moved that the Northern Rodeo Association purchase one membership to the North American Rodeo Commission for 1984, allowing the NRA three contestants to the NARC Finals Rodeo and a membership fee to NARC of \$6,250. Mike Lenning seconded. Passed.

The team roping in Denver in 1984 will pay the same as any other event, with each man winning the same amount of money as the winners of the other events.

The problems with Dodge's involvement with the North American Rodeo Commission were discussed. Communication problems between the rodeo committee and Coors was addressed.

In order to implement the East and West regions as standard procedure in the NRA by-laws, there will have to be a by-law change stating this. An attorney has been contacted and the necessary paperwork drawn up and will be acted upon by the Board of Directors in their meeting this date. As above stated, on February 1, 1984, the Montana Rodeo Association name has been dropped. Much discussion followed. Mark Norem moved that East and West regions be terminated. Ed Miller seconded. Defeated. Much discussion followed. The general consensus of opinion was that the regions stay as they have been since the signing of the Working Agreement.

Ed Miller moved that the resolutions outlining the regions be accepted by the Board at their meeting this date. Lois Hill seconded. Passed unanimously.

Awards were discussed. A big thank you was extended to Marlene Hawks for all of her work with the awards.

A slide presentation was made by Fred Ronai, Senior National Product Manager of Calvert Distillers, on Calvert's involvement with the North American Rodeo Commission and the Northern Rodeo Association for 1984. Calvert's involvement with the NRA through NARC will consist of ten rodeos in 1984. Advertising, posters, etc., will be made available.

Mary Colletti, Pueblo, Colo., presented Dial-A-Rodeo. She explained how her central entry system was set up and how it works. Questions were asked by the membership.

Sharon Martin presented her central entry proposal. Questions were asked.

All contestants are asked to make their feelings on central entry known to their event director for action on at the March meeting.

The meeting was adjourned.

Ed Miller moved that THE NORTHERN RODEO ASSOCIATION PURCHASE ONE MEMBERSHIP TO THE NORTH AMERICAN RODEO COMMISSION FOR 1984, ALLOWING THE NRA THREE CONTESTANTS FOR THE NARC FINALS RODEO IN EACH NARC SANCTIONED EVENT AND A MEMBERSHIP FEE OF \$6,250 TO NARC. Danny Cross seconded. Passed.

Discussion followed concerning the funding of the NRA membership to the North American Rodeo Commission. Ed Miller moved that: THE NORTHERN RODEO ASSOCIATION PAY THE MEMBERSHIP FEE TO THE NORTH AMERICAN RODEO COMMISSION OUT OF THE NRA GENERAL FUND AND THOSE CONTESTANTS COMPETING AT THE NARC FINALS RODEO PAY THEIR FEES (\$100 EACH EVENT). Mike Barthelmess seconded. Passed.

As per Working Agreement signed February 5, 1983, the Montana Rodeo Association name has been dropped as of February 1, 1984. Discussion followed.

Bill Stovall moved that DUES STRUCTURE FOR 1984 REMAIN THE SAME AS IN 1983. (New members: \$60; Old Members: \$60 until April 15; \$70 April 16 through May 15; \$80 May 16 forward.) Jay Linderman seconded. Passed.

Eastern and Western Region by-law change was brought up. All necessary paperwork has been drawn up. In order to implement the regions as standard procedure in the NRA the directors will have to sign the document including the change into the Association by-laws. Joe Smith moved that THE ADDITION TO THE BY-LAWS IMPLEMENTING THE EASTERN AND WESTERN REGIONS OF THE NORTHERN RODEO ASSOCIATION BE ACCEPTED AS PRESENTED AND INCLUDED IN THE BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION. Don Malli seconded. Passed. All directors signed the by-law change.

Discussion on a team roping rule was brought up. It was questioned whether a team roper can rope with a partner at the NRA Finals who has not as yet purchased a previous year membership card. Danny Cross moved that IN ORDER TO COMPETE AT THE NRA FINALS RODEO, A CONTESTANT MUST HAVE PURCHASED A CARD AND COMPETED IN THAT EVENT AT A NORTHERN RODEO ASSOCIATION APPROVED RODEO THE PREVIOUS RODEO SEASON. Glen Hough seconded. Passed.

Fred Ronai, Senior National Product Manager of Calvert Distiller Company, and Ed Harrison, Northwest Regional Manager, Calvert Distiller Company, made a slide presentation on Calvert's involvement in rodeo. The Northern Rodeo Association will receive Calvert's support through the North American Rodeo Commission for 1984. Ten rodeos will be chosen for this program in the NRA in 1984.

Mark Norem presented a program with Schaefer Outfitters, Jackson Hole, Wyo., through which the Northern Rodeo Association will sell their jacket with the NRA logo through the office. Schaefer Outfitter sponsored all fifth place awards in the NRA in 1983. Bill Davis moved that the jacket program be implemented. Danny Cross seconded. Passed. Mark Norem will complete the necessary arrangements for the jackets.

Mary Colletti, Pueblo, Colo., presented Dial-A-Rodeo. She explained how her central entry system was set up and how it works. Questions were asked.

Sharon Martin presented her central entry proposal. Questions were asked.

All directors are asked to receive feedback from the contestants in their particular event on the central entry proposals and the board will act on it for 1984 at the March meeting.

Dick Gifford has spoken with several Wyoming rodeo committees who wish to sanction with the NRA in 1984. The committees are as follows: Thermopolis, Greybull, Lovell, Cowley, and Meeteetse. Dick Gifford addressed the Board of Directors. Much discussion followed and questions were directed to Dick concerning quality of the stock, quality of rodeos, etc. Jay Linderman moved THE NRA ACCEPT DICK GIFFORD'S PROPOSAL ON THE WYOMING RODEOS AND ACCEPT HIM AS AN NRA STOCK CONTRACTOR. Bill Davis, seconded. Passed.

Bonding of stock contractors and rodeo secretaries was thoroughly discussed. The bonding will be researched and information brought back to the Board of Directors at the March meeting.

Todd Sanders has applied for membership in the NRA as a stock contractor. The Board feels the NRA requires additional information before making a decision. It was requested that Mr. Sanders attend the March meeting and the membership will be addressed at that time.

An awards committee needs to be set up to go over all bids for 1984 buckles and 1985 saddles. The committee will consist of Mark Norem, Lois Hill, Ed Waldhauser, Ed

Miller, Kent Mosher, and Glen Hough.

Junior awards program and junior events were discussed. A possible minimum entry fee of \$10 per event was addressed. The Junior awards and Junior events will be brought up at the March meeting. Tabled.

The letter which was requested by the Board to be sent to all stock contractors, secretaries and committees was made available for the Board signature.

Glen Hough moved the meeting be adjourned, Danny Cross seconded. Adjourned.

In order to maintain the effective coordination between the Northern Rodeo Association and Montana Rodeo Association, the following Operating Rules shall apply to all regional events:

1. There shall be two (2) regions in which events are held. A west region; and an east region.

2. Each contestant shall at the time that their card is purchased, choose which region their regional points earned by the contestant shall be credited.

3. Each rodeo event will be held in either the east region or the west region depending on the rodeo location chosen.

4. Regional standings for all contestants will be tallied and posted in either the east region or the west region.

5. For the purposes of determining an "event regional champion," the east region will be separate from the west region. Therefore, each region will have its own "event champions."

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

1. BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

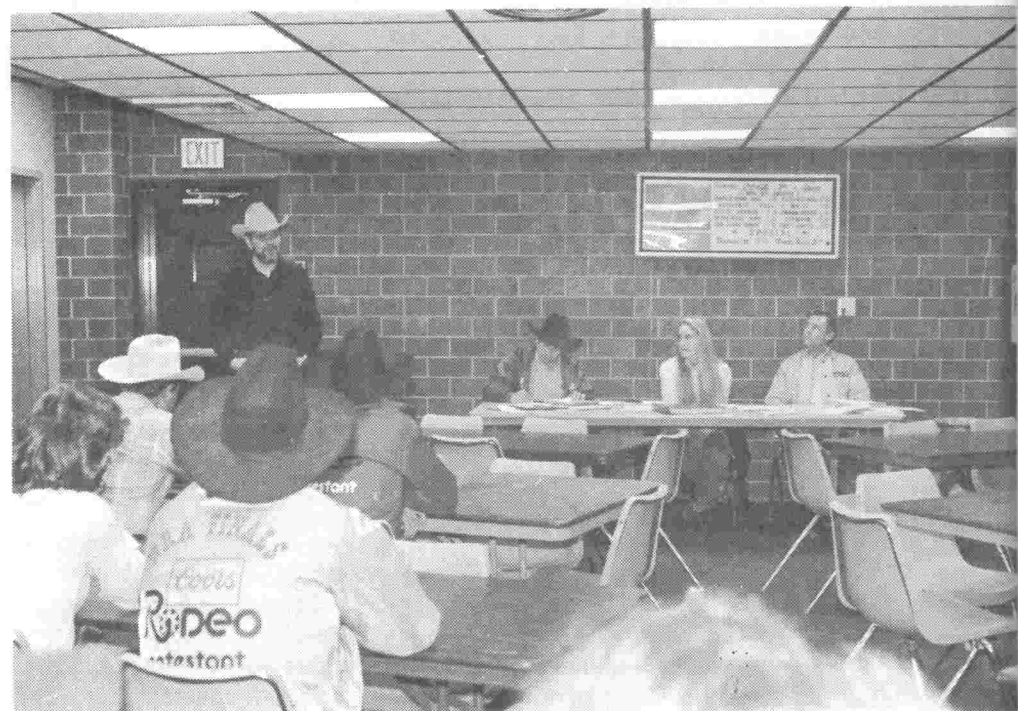

Lord Calvert Program Outlined

Canadian Lord Calvert is very pleased with its expanded rodeo involvement as an Official Sponsor of the Northern Rodeo Association for 1984 as announced at the recent NRA Finals by Fred Ronai, Senior National Products Manager of Calverts Distillers.

Those contestants with the best time or score in those events during the first performance will each win \$40.00. The remaining four events will be the CLC events for the second performance with \$40.00 awarded to those contestants with the best time or score during the second performance. This format, similar to day money, will give more NRA members a chance at the Canadian Lord Calvert Cash, and the CLC Cash will be directly awarded as soon as the winners are determined.

Cash awards will also be given to the stock contractor and announcer at the selected rodeos in recognition of their involvement and support of the CLC program.

Canadian Lord Calvert takes pride in its grass roots approach to rodeo sponsorship. My duties as the CLC rodeo consultant for Montana will include publicizing and directly coordinating the CLC program among commit-

tees, stock contractors and members of the NRA. I will also be on hand at all CLC selected rodeos to personally award the CLC Cash.

Additional information on Canadian Lord Calvert's sponsorship will be publicized as details are finalized.

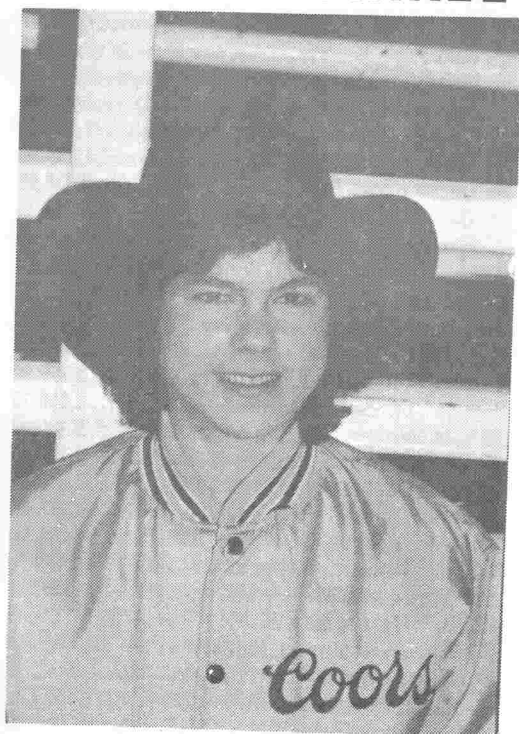

Northern Rodeo Assoc. History

The past years of the world's largest regional rodeo association have not always glittered with success. The history of the Northern Rodeo Association, formerly known as the North Central Montana Rodeo Association, finds its roots in the north central portion of Montana where rodeo has always been king — on those wide open prairies of Montana where the rodeo events evolved from the every day life of the ranchers.

Sometime in 1952, several ranch cowboys living in the small community of Roy, near Lewistown, decided they would get together on Sundays, go to the mountains, and cut posts, swipe snow fence, and build an arena. Other little towns like Winifred and Winnett had arenas then, and others like Geraldine, Judith Gap, Harlowton, Belt, Stanford and Lewistown. What do you do when your rodeo dates conflict with someone else's rodeo dates? You call the Rodeo Association and find out what dates are open. And what if there is no Association? Then you start your own.

And that's exactly what the boys from Roy did. They gathered about 36 people from all the surrounding towns that put on rodeos, elected officers and tried to decide what to call themselves. There were several names suggested and a lot of arguing. Finally one committeeman from Winifred said in disgust, "Well, if you can't decide on a good name, let's at least have a descriptive name." He continued, "Let's call ourselves the North Central Montana Rodeo Association."

Little did they know in those early days that the little association, whose name started out as a joke, would develop into the most powerful rodeo organization in the northwest.

For some reason, and no one really knows why, the association faced some insurmountable problems, and sometime during 1957 the organization fell apart and the NCMRA ceased to exist.

Where there are cowboys there are bound to be rodeos. Where there are rodeos there are bound to be problems, problems only an association can handle. Such was the case when several cowboys from the Great Falls area were having a friendly drink together in the early fall of 1959. It was mentioned that the judging at several of the surrounding rodeos was very poor, rodeos were doubling up on dates, and rodeo simply needed some standardization. The first organizational meeting was held Nov. 29, 1959. The problem of a name again came up and the decision that finally resulted was that the old familiar NCMRA would be used.

Nine rodeos were approved that first year, 91 members, and an end-of-the-year financial report of \$94.35.

This was the beginning. There were years when the association moved ahead, some when it moved back, depending on the interest, dedication and talent of the officers involved.

In 1969 the organization ended the year with a little less than 300 members and a bank account showing \$281 in the red. That was the last bad year the association had.

1970 appears to be the turning point. It was about this time that a "new" kind of cowboy began to emerge ... they've often been called the "new breed." These are the cowboys coming out of the ranks of high school and college rodeo, cowboys who had an education and who could see the possibilities of rodeo as a career ... a business. Slowly but surely the officers and directors of the organization made a transition and became a serious-minded business group. They injected a certain professionalism into the association which was reflected in the improvement of the quality of rodeos.

The organization grew and soon there was need for a full time employee to take care of it then an office etc., etc.

The name was changed in the fall of 1972 to reflect the all-encompassing nature of the rodeo association — the Northern Rodeo Association, for rodeos approved by the association were far out of the north central area of Montana that those plodding pioneers had known.

Lewistown, Montana, the geographical heart of the state, was known as the association's headquarters for many years. The newsletter of the association traditionally was edited and put out by the secretary, or the full-time employee. Coming out of the association's headquarters in Lewistown, it carried all the important and vital information for the cowboys. In 1975, the board of directors voted to make "The Chute Gate" published by Tom Alderson in Wyoming, the official publication of the Northern Rodeo Association.

During this time the offices of the association were moved around from Lewistown to Belt to ?, and finally to Billings. Not only did the publication originating from Wyoming falter and die, the association slumped somewhat, mostly from lack of a strong individual to manage and direct the association's activities from the office as the full-time employee.

In 1975 the organization reached some stability, and this was when the association headquarters moved to Billings. An organization, unfortunately, apparently needs a few

bad years to get its feet back on the ground and face reality, but in the past eight years or so, reality has meant that the Northern Rodeo Association is at the forefront of regional rodeo in the United States today. It approves over 40 rodeos a year, pays out well over a half million dollars in prize money, and boasts some 1300 members and numerous proud supporters.

After the move to Billings, the official publication came out of the headquarters and carried all the important news once again. In the fall of 1978 the present publication, the NRA News, was started, printed in Choteau, Mont. by volunteer editors, with strong collaboration and cooperation from the main office in Billings.

After the last rodeo of the season, usually Labor Day weekend, the boys would sit around and discuss the possibilities of having a finals rodeo, one which would add substantially to the year-end winnings and really culminate the rodeo season.

In the fall of 1973 the first NRA Finals became a reality. This one was held in the Rocklitz Indoor Arena at Glendive in late September. The next, 1974, the Finals moved to MSU's Brick Breeden Field House at Bozeman, and then in 1975 the first NRA Finals was held at the METRA in Billings. In 1976 George Runquist began his association with the NRA, and the best became even greater. From its shaky beginnings in Glendive, the NRA Finals has grown into the largest grossing rodeo in the state, and annually attracts the biggest crowds to watch the best cowboys and cowgirls in Montana.

The membership of the NRA includes businessmen, ranchers, housewives, teachers, doctors, lawyers, veterinarians, and people from all walks of life who like to spend their weekends at a rodeo somewhere close to home, and of course Montana is best.

In 1982 the NRA signed a working agreement with the historic and colorful Montana Rodeo Association, whose approved rodeos were generally west of the Continental Divide. This natural barrier in Montana, the Rocky Mountains, has proven to be not a barrier at all, and many cowboys and cowgirls were paying dues in the MRA in order to compete at their top rodeos. The idea of a working agreement was bantied about for several years before someone enlisted the aid of a lawyer to aid in a working agreement between the two corporations.

Again, the problem of a name came up. No one wanted to drop the name of their own association, and each had a unique history and

many memories in their long and colorful past. Both names were used. Cowboys only imagined that the name NCMRA was long and complicated. Try to convince the Associated Press to use rodeo results and standings when the name is "The Northern Rodeo Association and the Montana Rodeo Association."

Beginning with the 1984 rodeo season, only one name will be used, the Northern Rodeo Association. Although the complete scope of the association is probably best described with "MONTANA," it took a lawyer to determine what the name would be.

The association exists with two regions, an east and a west region. The west region encompasses all the rodeos which have traditionally been MRA rodeos, and the east region the NRA rodeos. This gives cowboys and cowgirls the chance to win a buckle or a title without have to travel long miles, and at the same time, those competitors who wish to hit the road hard, and make three or four rodeos a weekend, can do so with the hope of winning one of those beautiful year-end championship award saddles.

With offices in Billings, Mont., one full-time employee and a host of dedicated officers with business-like approaches to the greatest spectator sport in America, the Northern Rodeo Association will continue to breed success. And one reason for this success can be seen by simply watching an NRA rodeo ... great family entertainment ... the kind that brings fans back again and again.

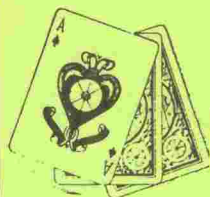

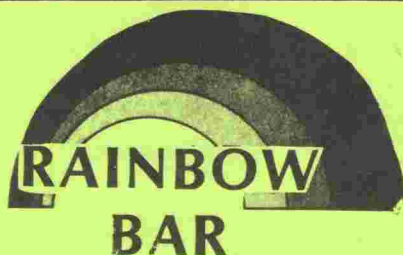

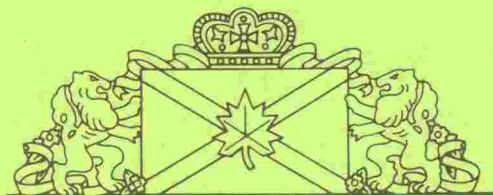
