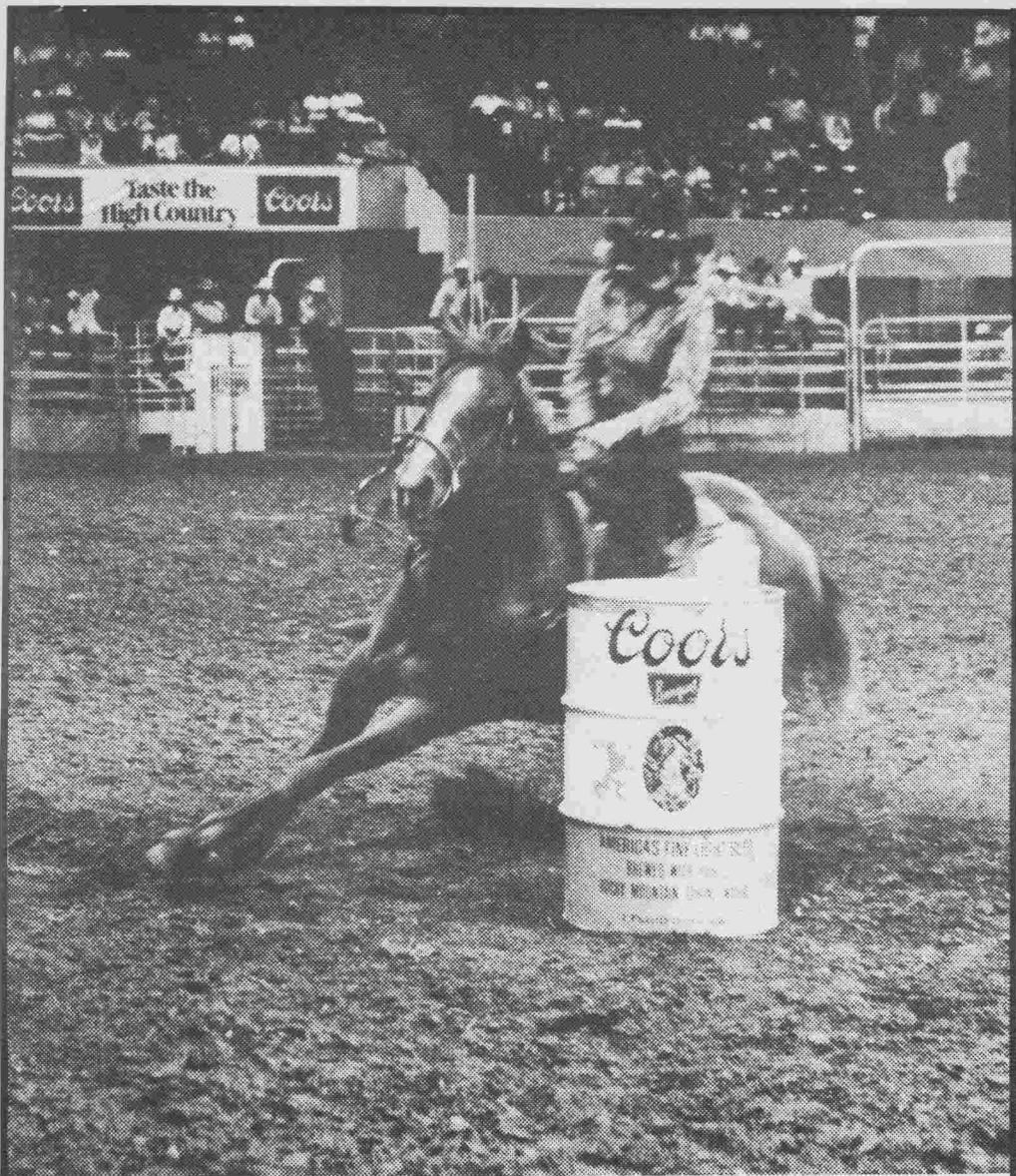

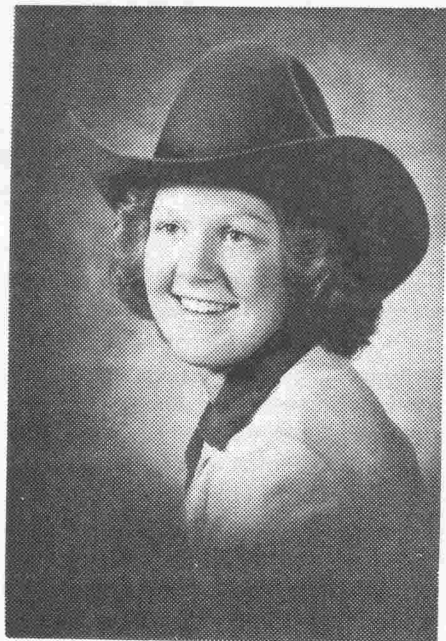

# LuAnn Hill Dies Accidentally

A host of relatives and friends were shocked and saddened by the sudden and untimely death of 20-year-old Lureen Ann (LuAnn) Hill, daughter of John and Lois Hill of Geyser, on Friday, Oct. 23. LuAnn died in a Denver, Colo. hospital from head injuries suffered in a freak fall at Rapid City, S.D. where she was a student at the National College. She was the reigning queen of the Northern Rodeo Association.

LuAnn had been associated with rodeo all her life, being a member of perhaps the most active and prominent rodeo family in the state. She was familiar with all aspects of rodeo, from being an active competitor, to helping in the background with secretarial duties, or even in the calf chutes. Her ready smile and quick wit were a welcome sight every weekend at a rodeo somewhere.

Born March 20, 1961, she was a 1979 graduate of Geyser High School where she was active in track, basketball, cheerleading and student council. She participated in high school rodeo, qualifying for the state finals, and representing District 3 as its queen. She also served as queen of the Yellowstone Exhibition rodeo. She and her Quarter Horse, Barbie Hard Way, were top barrel race competitors, and were leading the standings of the Great Plains region of the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association.

Rosary was recited Monday, Oct. 26 at St. Cyril's Catholic Church in Geyser, and services were held Tuesday, Oct. 27 in the same church.

Pallbearers were Guy Small, Rob Sauke, Jay Stenzel, Steve Eckroth, Clayton Annala, and Lennie McDonald.

Survivors include her parents, John and Lois Hill; a sister, Mary Ellen, and a brother, Lyle, all of Geyser; grandparents, Art and Lureen Klind of Raynesford, and numerous aunts, uncles, and cousins.

The family has suggested that memorials be sent to establish a barrel racing scholarship at the National College at Rapid City where LuAnn was a junior in business management at the time of her death. Send the memorials in care of Mark Maddox, Box 1780, Rapid City, S.D. 57701.

Our most sincere and heartfelt sympathy is extended to LuAnn's family. May the thoughts and prayers of their many friends sustain them at this difficult time.

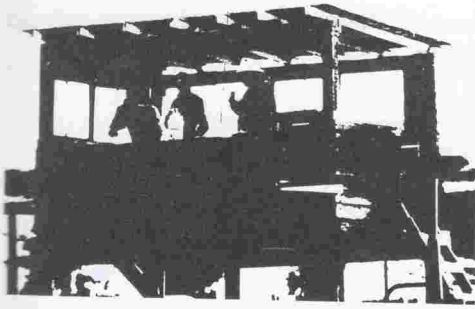

The seven performances of the North American Finals sponsored by the North American Rodeo Commission, are scheduled to begin on Nov. 10, and run through Nov. 14. All action will be held at the Denver Coliseum in Denver, Colo.

The 25 member associations of the North American Rodeo Commission are sending their top three contestants in each of the seven standard events to compete against each other. There are 14 stock contractors from throughout the nation furnishing stock for this rodeo.

The contestants will be checking in on Saturday, Nov. 7, with slack beginning on Sunday, Nov. 8, and continuing through Monday evening, with some being run on Tuesday morning to accommodate the few associations that are holding their own association finals Nov. 7 and 8. Each contestant will receive one head during the slack and one during the performances.

As the NARC directors expected when they changed the location and date from previous NAF, the events are filled with every top cowboy and cowgirl from across the U.S. and Canada in regional rodeo. The bucking stock will be ranker than ever before, with more availability at this time of year.

Plan to attend and cheer your favorite contestant on to winning part of the \$72,500 total payoff and one of the \$1000 Skyline buckles.

In addition, the Montana Barrel Racers Association used the opportunity to hold a barrel racing futurity to show off their best barrel racing prospects.

The Coors people were on hand to barbecue hamburgers for the hungry crowd Saturday night, and they all quenched their thirst with that great Coors beer.

Unfortunately, after suffering through the hottest September in years, just before the rodeo started on Saturday, a big black cloud rolled in from the north, bringing with it cold wind and rain, heralding the beginning of fall. Crowds were scant, especially on Saturday, but those who were present enjoyed some of the best cowboys versus some of the best stock in the state.

All-around cowboy was Rob Black who won a

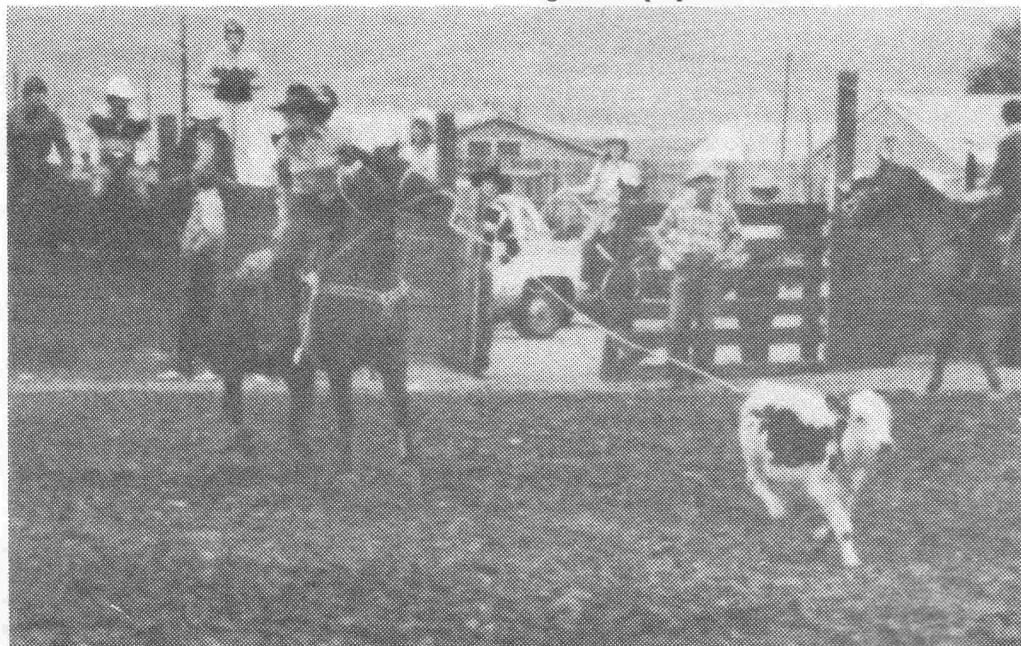
total of \$913.31, and all-around cowgirl was Janie Glennie with prize winnings of \$543.38.

The membership of both associations extends its thanks to the Montana Coors Distributors for putting on the rodeo, which was a great wrap-up to the 1981 rodeo season.



Janie Glennie won the breakaway roping in 3.01 at the Coors Appreciation Rodeo, and also was named the all-around cowgirl at that rodeo.





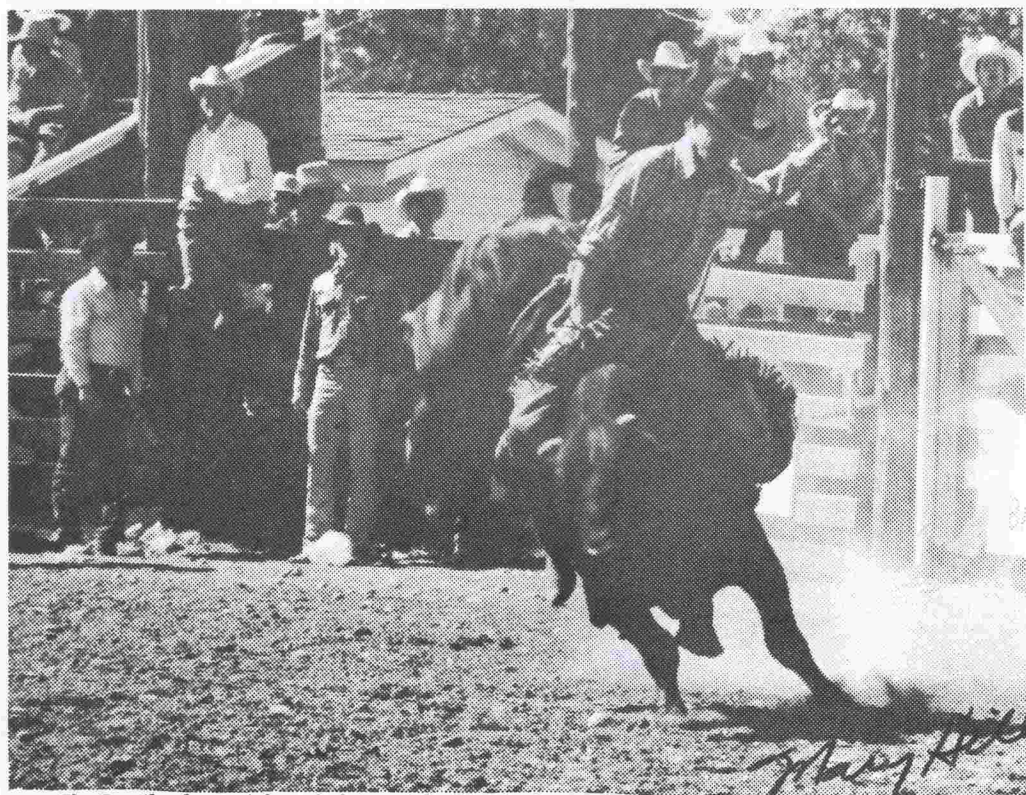
**Dallas Curry shows good calf roping form in these two action photos by Mary Hill at the Coors Appreciation Rodeo. Curry failed to place, however.**

# NRA Finals Set For Feb. 5, 6, 7

Throw your tooth brush and a clean shirt in a suitcase and head for the annual NRA Finals scheduled for Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Feb. 5, 6 and 7 in the climate-controlled Billings METRA on the Yellowstone Exhibition grounds.

Pitting the best cowboys against the best stock, the three go-around rodeo always puts the wintertime "blahs" in the closet.

A finals entry form is included in this issue, and contestants are asked to include a black and white head and shoulders photo with it, along with a membership application, completely filled out. # NRA - MRA Affiliation

## Letter to Editor

Dear Ed:

I wish to express my feelings in regard to the proposed merger of the Northern Rodeo Association and the Montana Rodeo Association. As I mentioned to you in our conversation today I have no objections to the merger providing that the name of the Association remains as the Northern Rodeo Association. I have been associated with this Association for many years and have been through one name change and several logo changes. Many hours have been spent by many dedicated cowboys, cowgirls, committeemen and stock contractors in making the Northern Rodeo Association one of the strongest and most respected regional rodeo associations in North America. Many rodeo committees have geared their advertising and promotions to the Northern Rodeo Association and the logo which represents it.

The growth of this Association has been a healthy growth, with all factions of rodeo, the contestants, committeemen and contractors having a part in this growth. I would be very disappointed if we started back to square one in the public relations and promotion department, which would be costly, and I feel that we would in all probability lose stature by such action.

Yellowstone "Fairtime" Exhibition

A letter of presentation advising committees of the merger was drafted. This will be sent out to all rodeo committees in the state of Montana.

The goal of this committee is to complete a package combining the associations. Once the final draft of the merger is completed it will be presented for approval to the board of directors of the two associations.

The following is a list of some of the issues which were covered at the meetings. None of this is finalized yet, so keep in mind that it will all be presented for the board's approval. If you have any thoughts or ideas, both pro and con, please contact your directors or association representatives and let them know.

1. Memberships for contestants who wish to rodeo in entire state at all approved rodeos.

2. Contestants rodeoing will be able to compete for their region's awards.

3. Proposed regions will be determined by Congressional district of member's home address.

5. There will be one director on the board from each region. He/she will choose a representative from their region.

6. There will be a President, Vice President, and the board will choose two persons from their region to be on governing board.

7. Association office and newsletter will come out of Billings.

8. A rodeo will pay day money if there is a minimum payoff of at least \$2,500 per event, \$5,000 in TR.

9. Membership cards will cost \$50 - April; \$60 - May; \$70 - June on. New members - \$50. Permits \$35. Junior \$10. Secretaries/Timers \$15.

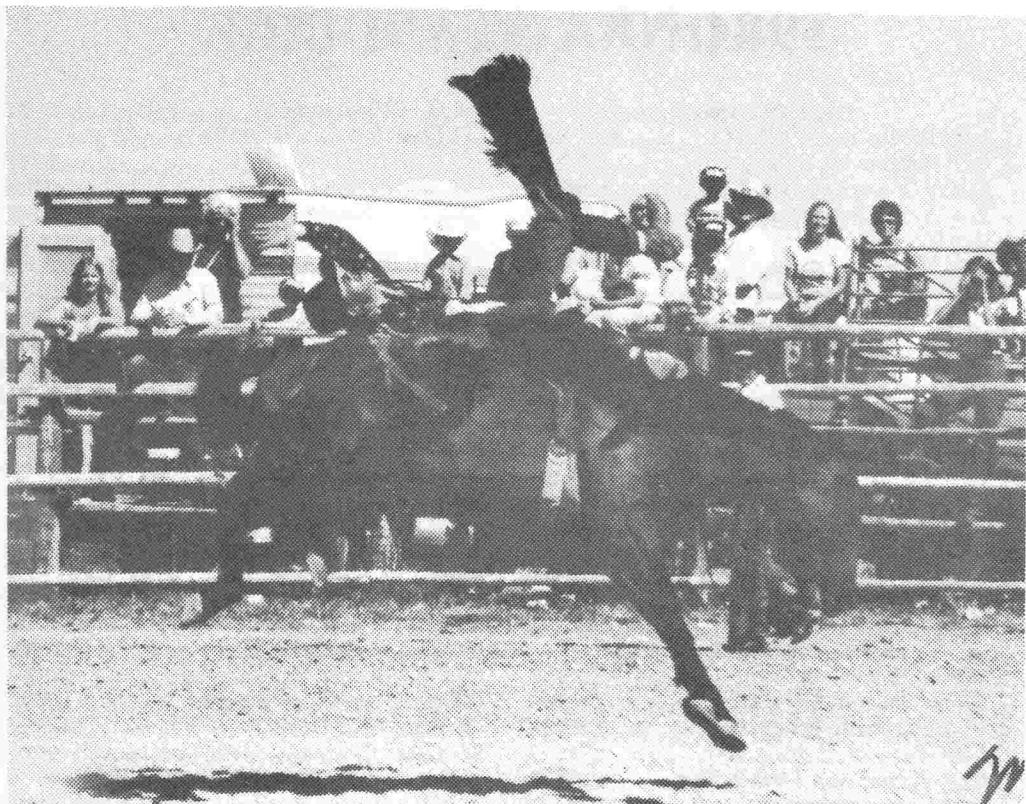
10. Articles and by-laws for both associations will be reviewed and put together by a lawyer hired for this purpose and to take care of the legalities involved with dissolving the two associations and forming a new one.

Both associations will be having board meetings shortly, so any input you may have to offer is welcomed. Again, please let them know!!

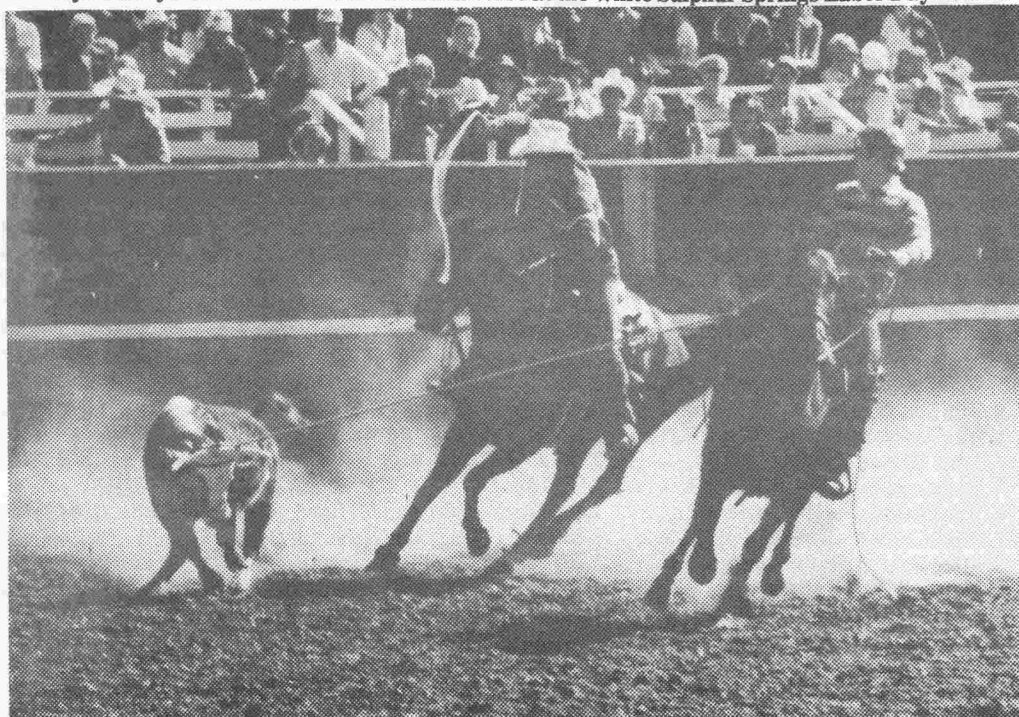
