Rodeo Royal To Be Held March 19 Through 23

The Rodeo Royal in Calgary, Alta., Canada is scheduled to open its second year utilizing the team rodeo concept on Wednesday, March 19 with Alberta facing British Columbia.

Held on the Calgary Stampede grounds and managed by that group, it is hoped that after last year's success, this year will be even bigger and better. Four teams are expected to compete: Alberta, British Columbia, Saskatchewan and Montana. Team Montana, made up of NRA and MRA members, will meet Saskatchewan on Thursday night. On Friday, the winner of day one will challenge the loser of day 2. Saturday, the loser of day 1 faces the winner of day 2. To culminate the whole extravaganza on Sunday, the winner of day 3 will meet the winner of day 4 for the championship.

Many of the meetings will be held at the Holiday Inn on McLeod Trail, and they are offering rooms at a special rate of \$32 per night during the Royal. The motel is only five blocks from the Stampede grounds. Address is 4206 McLeod Trail, phone 403-287-2700.



What can I say — our finals were a tremendous success! We set records with the largest crowd at a single rodeo performance, over 6,000 Saturday night, and most attendance at a multi-performance rodeo, over \$15,300! Now these are the kind of records we like to set! (this does not include the Yellowstone Exhibition Rodeo). Besides that we had one of the best rodeos anywhere. We are still getting calls complimenting us on our opening pageant and a just all-around great rodeo.

I wouldn't know where to start thanking everyone who worked so hard to make the NRF so fantastic and making the whole 1979 season such a great year for the NRA. A special thanks has to go to Orin Hough, our "singing star" of the opening pageant at the finals. A big thanks must be extended to all the people who assisted with the opening, and no one even fell off the flat saddles! Our sheep riders did really thrill the crowd, and congratulations must go to Jeff Whitchham of

Billings for out riding nine other good youngsters.

We must have our team picked for the Rodeo Royal by March 3. The NRA and the MRA will join to make Team Montana. The Royal starts on the 19th with Alberta vs. British Columbia, and on the 20th, Montana vs. Saskatchewan. Then on the 21st the winners of day one will play the losers of day 2, on the 22nd the winners of day two will play the losers of day 1, and the finals will be on the 23rd with the winners of days three and four competing for the Rodeo Royal championship. There will be an individual daily payoff with a team payoff to the winners of the finals. The Holiday Inn, 4206 McLeod Trail in Calgary, will have a cowboy rate of \$32 for a double room, and someone thought they said there was no limit to the number in a room. Howard "Doc" Holloway of Harlowton was selected at the general membership meeting as 1979 NRA Personality of the Year. Our heartfelt thanks and congratulations to Doc and his family.

The 1980 saddles are at the NRA office and ready to go on display at a proud donors' establishment. There are already three on display. The Spur has the men's all-around saddle up on their "trophy shelf." They said that it would look kind of bare without it sitting there. The women's all-around and the junior rope can, breast collar and an event saddle are in the glass display case at the METRA. As soon as we make a decision on buckles, spurs, etc., I'll let everyone know when they are available for donors to display.

A big special NRA thanks must go to each of our rodeo committees, donors and spectators, for without their loyal support the NRA wouldn't be the grand organization that it is today.

Congratulations to the new directors, and I'm looking forward to working with you in 1980. You have "big shoes to fill" as our 1979 board was a hard working efficient group. A note to the entire membership — you don't have to be an officer to help with the NRA's success, and as I have stressed before, and I cannot make it strong enough, the Northern Rodeo Association needs all of its people working together to continue our success.





Northern Rodeo Finals Termed 'Booming Success' By Promotors

Termed a "booming success" by its promoters, the Northern Rodeo Finals held in the METRA in Billings Feb. 1, 2 and 3, was just that, as it packed in more people than had ever watched an indoor rodeo in Montana before. Total attendance was over 15,300 for the three performances.

Surprises were many and disappointments were also thrown in for good measure. Steve Reeverts went into the finals leading the saddle bronc riding, failed to ride any of his three horses, and third place Gary "Birdshot" Richardson had a good finals to sneak ahead and win the year-end honors. Finals saddle

bronc winner was Jamie Byrne.

Karen Miller led the ladies breakaway roping standings, and it looked as though she would wrap it up, until Sunday afternoon when she failed to rope her last steer. Barb Rostad, on the other hand, roped each of her three steers in good time, and moved up from third in the standings to first, to win the breakaway saddle for the second year in a row. She also won the Finals buckle.

All-around cowboy for both the Finals and the year was Bob Schall, and all-around cowgirl for both the finals and the year was Cinde Barthelmess. She also won the year-end and finals barrel racing titles on her horse, "Speedy," who was named the horse of the

year in that event.

And besides the surprises and the disappointments, it was Orin Hough and the grand opening that wowed audiences. The patriotic opening in a time of unrest for America, and a little cowboy in a great big cowboy hat, brought lumps to the throats of all in the audience. And none of the riders in the grand entry fell off the English saddles. The hangups were few and injuries even fewer, and all in all, promoter George Runquist was happy with the way it went off. Clown John Gilstrap took his lumps inside the bull fighting barrel; a big black eye and a slight concussion incurred during a "funny" act. Sometimes it doesn't pay to be funny. Brian McNair was the bull fighter during the finals, and was named 1979 bull fighter of the year.

Even though Bob Schall won the bareback riding at the finals, Clyde Mury earned enough throughout the year and during the finals to win the year-end saddle. This was the first time in five years that Schall had not won the saddle. Bareback horse of the finals was Pat Byrne's Billy Sunday, and horse of the year honors again went to Dale Small's Little Star and Bud Geer's Yellowstone.

Although Danny Cross did not have a very good finals, he did manage to stay in the number one spot for the season in the calf roping. Scott Clements won the calf roping title at the finals. Cross' calf roping horse, "Roy," won the horse of the year honors in that event.

J.O. Hash of Red Lodge stayed in the lead in the steer wrestling all through the finals, even though he was pushed hard. Tom Charters won the average at the finals, much to his delight. Kent Mosher's horse, "Cindy," was named by the cowboys as the bull dogging horse of the year.

Glen Hough brought home the honors in the team roping teamed up with his long-time partner, Phil Luman. They won the finals, and Hough won the year-end honors, along with his horse, "New Yeller," who was named horse of

the year.

Eddie Baggs of Fort Worth, Texas won the bull riding crown for 1979 with Bill Stovall winning the finals. The bull of the year was "Bones," belonging to Dale Small, and Don Jacobs had the outstanding bull of the finals, "Danny Rabbit."

Joy Benson was named the All-Around Junior for 1979 and Jerry Knerr won the

Junior All-Around for the Finals.




